### 20<sup>th</sup> Roy Robertson Memorial Trophy 2005 Competition Report:

#### Saturday 15th

Twelve Competitors, including SAM1788 member, Geoff Potter, from Sydney, competed in our first event 1/2A Texaco. The weather was fine with light winds and our Cox .049's mostly behaved. Max's were enjoyed by all. Peter Bennett flying his yellow Red Ripper was 1st. Fred Stehbing's Stardust Special 2<sup>nd</sup> and Peter Hosking RC 1 placed 3<sup>nd</sup>.

Seven competitors entered for '38 Antique. The weather stayed fine and wind moderate. Three of the competitors retired with engine problems by the end of round one. Peter Bennett and Trevor Boundy proved very entertaining as their OK Super .60 engines were running perfectly and made easy work of obtaining three max's. Peter Bennett placed  $1^{th}$  flying his RC 1, Trevor Boundy  $2^{th}$  flying his Westerner and Steve Gullock's Gordon Burford diesel powered Poly finished  $3^{th}$ .

We shared the field with P&DARCS members and this arrangement proved once again successful. We were, how ever, troubled by low flying full size aircraft which seemed to be sight seeing and not aware or concerned at interrupting our contest.

#### Sunday 16<sup>th</sup>

After over night rain we were once again treated to a fine warm day with light winds. Twelve competitors entered for Texaco and most were able to enjoy good flying. At the end of round 4 it was decided to drop round 5 as the wind was freshening. Good lift was available most of the time. Mark Collins again flew well and was 1<sup>st</sup> flying ble Cumulus. 2nd place went to Fred Stebbing with his Thunder Tiger .36 powered Stardust Special and Chris Lawson flying a Lauzo Racer finished 3<sup>st</sup>.

Duration attracted eleven competitors and was also reduced to 4 rounds 3 to count contest as the wind continued to increase. Unfortunately this forced some aircraft to be withdrawn to save damage. Robert Taylor qualified for the fly off but a gust after landing in the 3<sup>rd</sup> round broke the wing of his YS powered Stardust Special. Also of note was Trevor Boundy's 90% Lanzo Bomber powered by an Anderson Spitfire .65 "Sparky" which he has prepared and tested. Trevor chose to withdraw when the wind continued to increase. Mark Collins flying a Contulus once again showed his skill and knowledge of the 'Burley' field and finished 1<sup>rd</sup>. Kevin Fryer with his Comulus was 2<sup>rd</sup> and Chris Lawson with his Italian designed Vespa finished 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Congratulations to Mark Collins for winning the Roy Robertson Memorial Trophy 2005. Unfortunately for Mark his SAM600 friends have already started to plan a "How to heat Mark in 2006" with the most popular idea being! "Steal bis wings"? We will wait and see!!

Twelve contestants, including three MRCAC members contested 1/2A Texaco. Fine weather with varying lift made a good contest. Fred Stebbing's Stardust Special finished first, Barry Barton also flying a Stardust Special came second and Kevin Fryer's Atomizer third.

The Gordon Burford Diesel Competition attracting eight entries was flown in similar conditions but was made interesting as patches of severe sink were hard to dodge. Fred Stebbing. continuing his good flying, finishing first flying his Swiss Miss powered by a plain bearing Burford. Brian Laughton also flying a Swiss Miss but powered by a ball bearing Burford was second, and third was Chris Lawson flying his plain bearing Burford powered RC 1.

Texaco, flown in freshening wind with severe sink only attracted 5 entries. Peter Bennett was unfortunate to have a gust of wind tip his plane over and break the wing before the competition had started. It was then decided to fly only two rounds with the second flown as in a fly off and scores from the two rounds totalled. Chris Lawson was declared the winner flying his Lanzo Racer, Barry Barton's Anderson Pylon was second and Brian Laughton's Lanzo Bomber finished third.


The presentation was conducted after this event and a good day was had by all. Regards.

#### KIEL KRAFTS BAD GUYS

During the 40's,50's and 60's, E. Kiel and Co. Ltd manufactured the extensive Kiel Kraft range of Free Flight, Control Line and early Radio Control kits. Their designers were Eddie Kiel himself, staff designer Bill Dean and several designs by Albert Hatfill. Among my favourites of their power models are what I call "The Bad Guys". The 34" Pirate, 44" Bandit and the 50" Outlaw. It was common for KK to design a model and produce it in various sizes in order to cover the market. Usually but not always the middle size came first followed by the "Mite' and then the "Super". With the bad guys the Bandit was first then the Pirate and finally the Outlaw. The Bandit has lovely olyptical flying surfaces with polyhedral, cabin fuselage and an upright engine. The Pirate is almost identical but is smaller and has simpler dihedral wings. The Outlaw has squarer type tips and polyhedral. Either the Bandit enlarged to 50" span or the Outlaw at normal size could make interesting and very pretty Burford models. The plan for the Pirate is shown on page 13 and all plans and full kits are available from Buckle's in the U.K. Fred.
