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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Hi Everybody,

Hope you are all had a good Christmas and a Happy New Year.

The competitions, those we have been able to run, due to the weather, have been good.

Wangaratta was an interesting competition with the thermals coming in big, then lots of sink. The take off and landing area was not very easy fly from; walking from the opposite end of the take off line and having to walk behind other flyers and their equipment made things difficult.

The two day comp at Cohuna was good for me, winning Texaco, Climb and Glide, and Burford. Of the events that I won (legally), some have commented that they allowed me to win because I'm the new el Presidente and they're scared of me.

Having a competition with a combination of electric models flying with but not against the IC models, to me was a success, and I hope this will result in having more people at events, than just the secret seven in IC.

Climb and glide is a success with the boys from Cohuna flying their electric polystyrene models. They seem to only now realize that a white polystyrene model can't be seen at the height needed to be competitive. There were a few models that got lost in the air, people thinking that they were flying their own models but alas, it wasn't. Fortunately all the models lost have since been retrieved.

Watching the electric model searching for the lost models flying FPV was a eye opener; just to see the pilot staring into his glasses showing the terrain below and up to 8km away. He also could look at his laptop computer, seeing on the screen what he could also see through his glasses.

Having the general meeting at Cohuna gave us more people at the meeting, and resulted in us being able to discuss things with more voices for feed back. The main discussion point at the meeting was defining the take off and landing areas. We will now have to present a rule that clearly defines that the take off area is into the wind and the landing area is behind and if possible not adjacent to the pits. By creating a safety corridor between the pits and the take off and landing areas enables flyers to have an area to stand without the possibility of obstructing others trying to take off or land or having others obstruct their efforts to take off or land. After taking off the pilot moves back into the pits from the take off line to fly his model; and when landing the pilot moves into the safety corridor but does not enter the landing area with his aircraft still in the air.

Sam Rules clearly state that the landing area has to be the MINIMUM of 100mx100m or 10,000sqm, and larger if possible. The adopted system is illustrated in the sketch below. This was accepted by the members present. If this field set up is followed then everyone can fly with confidence that there will be no other flyers launching models from the pits and wandering around the defined landing area trying to land models. By using this safety corridor when emergencies arise taking off, landing and retrieving models can be done safely and without undue hindrance to others.

Steve Gullock presented a layout that comprised a safety corridor in front of and behind the pits.


Take off is outside this zone and then pilots are to move back into the pits. Landing is behind the pits and pilots are not to leave this area until the aircraft is on the ground.

The only time pilots or anyone are to be in the landing area is to retrieve a model and they are not to enter until the model is on the ground.
