




MINUTES OF SAM 21 MEETING April 28, 2011

Meeting called to order by President Brian **Sargent** at 7:10 PM. There were 10 members present and no quests.

Minutes of the March meeting as printed in the newsletter were approved by voice vote.

The Treasurer, Lescher **Dowling**, reported he is still having discussions with the bank but, in the meantime, we are very solvent. Paid up members to date are 46.

The SAM 21 annual contest set for May 21-22 was discussed in various detail. Jake **Chichilitti**, the CD, was absent from the meeting but he had expressed his concern previously about help at the contest. Gary **Leopold** asked for input as to what to serve at the Saturday night banquet and the club authorized him to buy some steaks. It's difficult to know how much of the food to order since we have no idea what the attendance will be; much depends on the weather. Brian **Sargent** volunteered to work the B-B-Q.

Dave **Lewis** passed around the results of the club's Spring 1/2A Texaco & Speed 400 contest last Sunday (Easter). The results might be printed elsewhere in this issue. His comment was: Never ever put on a contest on a national holiday, especially Easter.

Dave **Lewis** advised that our wind-sock on top of the shed at Schmidt's Ranch was torn up and blown down by the winter storms. Bill **Copeland** will get a new wind sock with "SAM 21" printed on it and it will be installed before our contest date.

Steve **Roselle** advised that SAM 21 will have a booth at the Wings of History Museum Open House, Morgan Hill, set for May 14 and asked members to bring models to display next to the booth. It would be great if we could get some little wind-up planes for the kids to put together and fly; this has been popular in the past.

The subject of flying at the Garlic Festival Parking lot was brought up but the field is now surrounded by a cyclone fence with a locked gate. This was in conjunction with SAM 21 hosting the CLASH OF THE TITANS. Dave **Lewis** suggested we check with the PCC's field just off Highway 1 south of Half Moon Bay which is just about halfway. Gary **Leopold** will check with PCC officials.

After some discussion it was decided to have a raffle or auction of modeling stuff at the next (May) meeting. We couldn't decide if it should be just a raffle or a silent auction or some variation but bring your unwanted stuff to the next meeting and it could find a good home.

SHOW AND TELL: Lescher **Dowling** had tickets for \$10 each for a ride on a B-17 or a B-24. He also ran across post cards and refrigerator magnets of his two models hanging from the ceiling of the Valdez, AK History Museum. He found these items on the internet. Gary **Leopold** showed his very nice Comet CLIPPER MK 1 with O&R 60. The engine is fully cowled and the model is covered with red transparent Ultracote Lite. He bought the plane as a bare-bones Free Flight from the estate of Walt **Parker** of Salinas.

Dave **Marshall** read some excerpts from a biography about a glider friend of his telling about towing a glider from the east bay to El Mirage glider port with a 1936 Plymouth. Then there was discussion about where the glider should be when under tow: above the glider tug or below the tug.

Could this be part of the structure we know today as the Schmidt Ranch house? Only Eut Tileson knows for sure. Perhaps we will find out this weekend?




Notes From The Right Seat

.. Is this a good idea? (the communication part - not Dave's Driving - which is never a good idea)




We found him just finishing his lunch - which, by the way, he did not offer to share?? He was also nursing a nose bleed and had to continue pinching his nose throughout our visit.

Picture Post Card Perfect

Ed Note: During the March SAM 21 meeting, Lescher Dowling presented Post Cards with the photos you see here. As these models are obviously "museum quality" I felt they deserved more detailed examination. As you read keep in mind that each model spans 100 inches and weighs approximately 30 to 35 lbs.

In 1987 Dorothy and I visited Valdez, Alaska on an Elderhostel Program. I volunteered to make a replica model of the Alexander Eaglerock, the first airplane to fly in Valdez. I found plans in the book, Alexander Eaglerock by John deVries and enlarged them to 7 ft. WS, 1/5.28th scale. I knew this had to be an archival model so instead of using balsa and silk I replicated the full scale steel tubing fuselage with 7/16 brass tubing and silver solder, used birch for the wing leading and trailing edges and spars and 3/32 beech ply for the 63 ribs and 120 half ribs. The covering was Ceconite, a full scale light weight polyester fabric. Finish was two coats of nitrate dope, two coats of butyrate dope, one coat of Krylon primer and one



coat of Krylon Regal Blue or Metallic Silverand weighed about 30 lbs. The Eaglerock was finished December 23, 1989 and shipped to Valdez, AK in a homemade crate on January 5, 1990. We attended another Elderhostel in Valdez for the Museum Dedication and Eaglerock Installation Ceremony Memorial Day, May, 28, 1990. The model has full joystick and rudder pedal controls and a replica OX-5 V-8 engine under the hood made form a small aerosol can, Band-Aid can and copper pipe.

After the installation ceremony, Joe Leahy, the Valdez Heritage Museum Director offered me a grant to build a same scale replica of bush-pilot Bob Reeve's Fairchild 51. The 51's were never manufactured: they were Model FC-1A "Razorbacks" that were converted to squarebacks for more cargo space. Bob Reeve's Fairchild was fitted with skis and used to land gold miners on the glaciers behind Valdez. He took off from the mud flats near Valdez. My replica Fairchild 51 was made from the same kind of materials as the Eaglerock, brass tubing, birch, beech ply, Ceconite fabric and nitrate and butyrate dope and Krylon spray cans. I used plans from The Historical Aviation Album, Vol. XVII, by Paul R. Matt. The WS was 100" and I used a Williams



Brother's plastic Wright Whirlwind engine model modified with a brass candlestick base and 1/4" copper tubing for the forward manifold. Whereas I spent two years building the Alexander Eaglerock, Bob Reeve's Fairchild 51 was wanted in six months for a Fiftieth Reunion of the Reeves family leaving Valdez! I finished on time and again a homemade plywood crate was made to ship the 35 lb. Fairchild to Valdez. We were invited back to Valdez, AK, in February 1991 to help install the plane and participate in the ceremony. I shipped the model on December 21, 1990. On January 1, 1991 new Environmental Air Quality rules went into effect in California banning the use of such materials as Acetone, Heptane, Xylene, and Naptha in Propane spray cans. Krylon went to mostly water base paints!

Cooperative and Interrelated Bay Area Outreach Modeling Activities - The Future Of Bay Area Model Flight?

Participants: NASA Ames Research Center, South Bay Soaring Society (SBSS), Pacific Coast Channel Commanders (PCC) and SAM-21(Society of Antique Modelers, Chapter 21)

During March and April, 2011 there were three outreach activities that quite ironically were interrelated by chance. Through my membership in SAM-21, I was introduced to PCC's upcoming week long model aviation presentation to Pacifica's Oceana High School. Unfortunately, I was only able to participate two days. During the NASA tour for the Oceana students I met NASA's Dr. William **Warmbrodt** and Ashley **Pete**, a VTOL simulation project leader and mentor for NASA interns.

As a result of having membership in SBSS, I invited Ashley **Pete** and her interns on behalf of SBSS to experience introductory R/C sailplane flying as a return gesture for NASA's fantastic tour for the Oceana students. SBSS maintains a fleet of trainer planes and transmitters. The interns flying venture turned out to be a truly mutually enjoyable experience. We're both planning on doing this again with Ashley's next group of interns. What is particularly gratifying for me is the realization we modelers of all three

clubs (PCC, SAM-21 and SBSS) share a mutual interest in outreach. Ironically, during our NASA tour Dr. Warm-

brodt told us about the President's mandate to NASA for education outreach. NASA is seeking high school candidates to apply for their internship program to encourage STEM studies (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math).

Gosh, what synergy and common interest between these four groups! It's my hope and my effort to pursue a SAM-21 colleague's suggestion, "Maybe we should form an outreach collaborative with All Bay Area AMA clubs!"

It'd be great to turn an outreach program with community giveback into a win-win opportunity to possibly open up some new flying sites.

As a return gesture for NASA Ames and Dr. **Warmbrodt's** gracious and educational tour to the Oceana High School, SBSS invited the NASA interns under the tutelage of Ashley **Pete** to introduce all to their first real, hands-on R/C flying experience. SBSS maintains sev-

eral trainer planes and transmitters with buddy boxes for the sole purpose of introducing and training newcomers to model aviation and R/C flying.

Thanks to all the SBSS'er volunteers who brought out several Vistas, a winch, and all kinds of coaching expertise. We really enjoyed teaching the interns, but more importantly the grins and smiles of the interns were wonderfully rewarding for us.

SBSS's biggest reward was a request from Ashley **Pete** who asked if she could bring her next group of NASA interns for flying experience. SBSS gave her a standing, open invitation for complimentary introduction and training flying - the same as we offer to the public.

P.S. Thanks and appreciation to all that in any way contributed to this very successful project!




