The last major contest, the 39th annual SAM 27 Crash and Bash, held once again at the Schmidt Ranch, is behind us. From all accounts the event was a success enjoying mostly benign weather conditions, an up tick in registrations, drawing participants from Italy, Oregon and Southern California.

As you will read elsewhere in this issue, congratulations to Tom **Empy** who was

awarded the championship **Hooks Trophy** which was well deserved as Tom overcame considerable adversity to find himself at the top of all competitors at the end of the three day competiton. Tom traveled from Oregon and said that "he was not used to such an honor."

Now we are on to the balance of 2014 with the 1/2A/Speed 400 club contest on Saturday, October 18th at the Dwarfs field in South San Jose, and our annual Collecto scheduled for November 15th at the same venue as last year. Then we close out the year with the December "Pirates" event.

The Year 2014 has been a year that has seen some new activities which seemed to spark a renewed interest in meeting attendance and building and flying. It is hoped that the interest and participation continue through 2015.

The September meeting will feature a discussion/decision on the subject of the proposed 2015 Build/Fly Project. Several models have been mentioned including the Tlush Mite and Benny Boxcar. There are avid supporters in both these camps and perhaps some other designs to be 'nominated'. The criteria to be considered in the choice include:

1)Simple design;

2) Up to a 72" wing span;

3)SAM approved design;

4) Having enhanced gliding quality

5) Using the same motor and electronics purchased for the Simplex.

'elephants eye' corn downwind, starting at the RR tracks and going further downwind for as much as a half mile. The wind on Saturday morning was strong enough to affect the flights of smaller models. The number of contestants was up noticeably over last year, Good news for a change.

The eventual Champion, Tom Empy, also made friends with the corn – more than once, but managed to recover his models successfully in spite of ankle deep mud from recent irrigation, on Saturday. His win is testament to his perseverance throughout the weekend.

As Dave noted in his report, the 'Crash and Bash' lived up to its name judging from the number of broken models seen scattered about. I believe Stan Lane of SAM 30 suffered the most with at least three 'victims'. Another notable loss included a large Stardust Special involved in a Saturday Fly Off when the wing folded.

The Great Simplex Smackdown, Ver. 2 was flown on Saturday morning as a Fun event. The bottom line was that everyone did have fun and the event, which started at 9:30, was finished by 11:30 – just in time for lunch – and did little to interfere with the flying of 'regular' contest events. Of note, the SimpleX project first and second place winners took home the 'added purse' of very nice Tower Hobbies Gift Cards.

Lunch on Saturday and Sunday depended on cook, Ned Nevels, who was up to the task. Good burgers and dogs. The banquet Saturday evening was held at a local restaurant and reports were that the food and service were both excellent. This venue will probably become the traditional banquet location for future contests and perhaps fun fly events as well, as no one had to volunteer to cook, plus there was no cleanup!!!

2014 POND EVENT supplemental information:

The <u>ALOT</u>special event may be flown either day. AMA signup is required, but there's no entry fee and it isn't included in the Sweepstakes tally.

The site is several miles east of Taft and about 6 miles south of the Bakersfield City Hall. It's an improved RC field with a 70' X 600' usable runway surrounded by large dirt run-off space, then flat farmland. There's a permanent canopy shade cover, work benches, picnic tables, porta pot, trash bin, frequency board, etc. Not having to bring shade tents and tables will leave you more room for models in your transportation piece.

There are start- up/engine tuning stands with wing restraints between the canopy and flight line. The runway is long enough for takeoff at one end and the usual landing behind at the other. If you can't hit the runway there's not the endless open space of Taft, but still roomy open flat dirt areas north, east and west. The dirt areas are dusty just like Taft, and we'll use takeoff mats on the runway, even though it's improved over the surrounding area.

The Greenfield Fliers are AMA club #4741 if you'd like to look them up on the AMA web site. Their Google earth/ GPS location is 35.26219225N 118.96879393W.

FIELD DIRECTIONS:<u>Southbound:</u> Taft highway, (rte.119) runs east and west, crossing both I-5 and Hwy 99 a few miles south of Bakersfield. From either I-5 or Hwy 99, exit and go east on 119. Travel about a mile east of Hwy 99 to Union Ave. and turn right (south).

Note: East of Hwy 99, Taft Hwy (119) gets renamed Panama Road. Don't be confused by a Panama Lane which runs parallel to Panama Road but is a mile or so further north

Go south about a mile to Di Giorgio Rd. and turn left (east). Go about 2 miles along Di Giorgio with one stop sign along the way. Watch for a lonesome house on the left with tall palm trees in the yard. Just past that house and on the same left side is an unpaved road going north to the field. There's a quite small sign at that left turn saying "Greenfield Fliers" at the base of a utility pole. After a few hundred yards, angle left through the gate to the field.

Northbound shortcut- coming from the south, where Hwy 5 branches left, away from Hwy 99, continue on 99. Then in about 11 miles, branch rightonto Union Ave. And follow it about 6 miles to DiGiorgio Rd. Turn east and follow the instructions above. It's easy to overshoot Di Giorgio Rd. since there's no stop sign there on Union and the street sign is just a common residential size street sign. But there are easy turnarounds if you overshoot.

Historic note: Union Avenue is "old" Hwy. 99 with some of the eucalyptus trees still remaining.


