





Dave Warner won overall sweepstakes by a good margin. Brian Sargent was runner up. We're getting used to frequently smaller turnouts. Once Again, there was more schmoozing going on than flying.

But President Rick Trani had single handedly done most or all the work, since his previous helpers were scattered about doing various other things, most with good excuses, such as recuperation from surgery. MORE ABOUT THE CONTEST: With just 14 signed-in fliers, we'll certify it as another laid back event, in which as much schmoozing occurs, as flying. If we listed all the event entries that would have to be marked DNF or Did Not Fly, it would take up about four pages rather than two. The weather cooperated nicely, but a few beads of perspiration did pop out at midday for those who were extra active during the best thermal activity. A few dust devils were spotted, but all missed us with one exception. Your Editors Windfree sailplane is prone to tip stalls, and on one flight, it had a couple of quite violent upsets that I couldn't understand.. Later, Brian Sargent said I'd flown through the edge a developing twister that hadn't quite collected enough dust in it for me to see.

**AMA RULES** specifically prohibit team entries in RC flying events, since it's a flying skill event. There's no builder of the model rule in SAM flying, so all awards go to the flier. But Dale Tower and Phil Bernhardt work nicely as a team, in that Dale builds some nice ships and Phil does some quality flying. So while all awards and sweepstakes contest points go to Phil, we show both names in the results. You'll see them first listed in E Texaco at Loren Kramer over Phil and Dale (rhymes with Loren over hill and dale). Sorry for the bad pun.

**EXPERIENCE:** I'm a somewhat experienced CD, but I gathered up even more of that stuff at this event. Having used the Rocket Shop Café for our Saturday night banquet for several years, I'd become complacent about their ability to accommodate us. So, for the first time, I didn't call them a few days before the event. I waited to get a reasonable head count the afternoon of the banquet. This time, for some odd reason they had begun closing at 2 PM on Saturdays. A mild scramble ensued to get everyone directed to choice # 2. Some had already retreated to motels for the day. But in the end all were contacted and found their way to Don Peridos (SP?) for a noisy night of revelry there. Food was good, but a different choice will be made next time due to the noise level, which was a little louder than the flight line.

**COTTON FARMS** and flying fields are not a good mix. At least four of us became acquainted with cotton farming. The large open field immediately to the north was planted with a mature cotton crop. If any natural hazard exists around a flying site, one or more models will find it. In this case that magnificent "Big Gull" of the Bernhardt / Tower team found it first, followed by Bob Angel's fairly new B/C glow Playboy. Both ships were damaged. I'm not aware of any others that got planted alongside the cotton.

The big problem was retrieval. The Big Gull was at the North edge of the cotton field, or was it a little beyond? Anyway it wasn't very far in so that a vehicle excursion along the far north edge quickly located and retrieved it. The Playboy went down in two parts, with the fuselage going straight down and planting itself, while the wing rotated lazily all the way down, completely unharmed.

There was lots of retrieval search and rescue help. Phil Bernhardt recovered the Big Gull, but also found and fetched Bob's Playboy fuse in near impossible conditions. So what caused the problems? The Big Gull apparently had a radio failure of the Spectrum radio. And my (Bob's) problem was caused by the bad judgment of flying too high, just 4 days before cataract surgery. Near the end of the power run it did a high G stunt, separating wing and fuselage. That was abetted by poor design of the Ben Buckle Playboy kit whose construction deviated from the original plans in several places. The front wing hold-down dowel was only inserted 1" into the pylon and directly under the weak horizontal wing support cross planking. Usually when such separation happens it's from a wing failure, but in this case the weak dowel placement jus lifted right out taking a top front piece of the pylon. So I don't recommend Ben Buckle kit
