

Fred Won The Kotuku Cup F1E @ Lost Hills.

(Or The Story Behind The Fish Hook Trophy)



Fred had that serious competitor look on his face.

Before and after the free flight world champs held at Lost Hills in October, there were two World Cup contests that allowed not only world champs free flight competitors but also others from every country in attendance to fly for World Cup points in the following categories:

F1A Nordic Towline Glider

F1B Wakefield Rubber Powered

F1C FAI Gas powered

**F1E** Magnetic Steering Gliders (the event that I won)

Also, the Mini FAI classes were flown, which counted for America's Cup points but could only be won by U.S. citizens and Canadians. Those were:

F1G Coupe dHiver Rubber Powered

F1H Small Nordic Towline Glider

F1J Mini (1cc) FAI Power

F1P Gas Power (1cc) with no auto surfaces

F1Q Electric Power

F1S Small Electric Power (36 inch wingspan)

New Zealand hosted the Kotuku Cup, which is always flown at Lost Hills in October and the Kiwi Cup which is flown in February. The Sierra Cup is hosted by SCAT (the Southern California Aero Team) and its origins began around 1975-76 and flown at Waegell Field near Rancho Cordova. It was created by well-known FAI Power flyer Roger Simpson (now deceased). It was moved to Lost Hills when construction of residential homes north of Waegell Field impeded our retrieval territory to the north. Those contests were always well attended for almost thirty years by many other countries, including the U.S.

The F1E (Magnetic Steering Glider) Kotuku Cup was the first event to be flown, which was Thursday, October 10th, followed by the Sierra Cup on Friday, October 11th. As you can see from the results, there were only seven contestants entered (one from the U.K.) Other countries that would

normally participate did not arrive until just before the World Champs and likely did not have enough room in their baggage to transport additional large models even if they could have flown earlier.

Depending on conditions (wind, direction, calm) the contest director can determine how long each max flight has to be. He chose to fly five rounds starting at 10 am and a max time per round of 2-1/2 minutes (150 seconds).


