### History of SAM21 & Society of Antique Modelers.

After I pleaded for more information on history of SAM21 in the last Clipper, I received a nice email from Mike Myers.

And now something for you on the birth of SAM (at least as told from a SCIF (Southern California Ignition Flyer) viewpoint). According to us SAM was born in the backseat of a Chrysler sedan traveling from a Stockton Gas Model Club contest back to San Francisco circa 1961 or 1962. The story goes this way. Lee Freeman (SAM HOF member) and John Pond were good friends. Lee lived in Los Angeles (and by the late 50s e Pond had moved from San Diego where he was a draftsman for the Navy) to San Jose. Lee and John liked to go to model airplane contests together, but Mrs. Freeman was not having any part of traveling to small towns or dusty venues to attend a model airplane contest. So Lee and John worked out this deal. Lee and his wife would fly to San Francisco and take a hotel on Union Square mid day on Friday. John would drive u to San Francisco early on Saturday, pick Lee up and off they'd go to a model airplane contest. Mrs. Freeman amused herself in San Francisco for the weekend. John and Lee would drive back to San Francisco late Sunday afternoon. Along the way back from a Stockton Gas Model Club Contest Lee and John got to talking about "wouldn't it be nice" if there were contests for the kinds of airplanes that they'd flown as kids in the 1930s and 1940s., They decided to set up a group to do it—I've forgotten whether Lee or John was the one that agreed to be President and promoter of the new group, but both of them proved to be too busy with other things to carry through. That said John did arrange for Old Timer events as part of one or two of the AMA Nationals in the early 60s. The burden of organization was passed on to Tim Dannels—who was already putting out a newsletter for an early MECA group.

One of the things that John was busy with was collecting plans for old timer models—or having plans drawn up from memory or photos (after all John was a draftsman by training). At one time I had a letter from John Pond to Kenny Sykora (an early member of SCIFs) dated 1965 or so. Both Kenny and John were gathering old timer plans at the time. John was excited in the letter—he'd collected (or had drawn) plans for three old time models just that month! Jim Adams, Sal Taibi, Gene Wallock, Bob Oslan, Abe Gallas and others were active in the SCAMPS (Southern California Antique Model Plane Society—SAM Chapter 13) in the late 60s. I've seen contest reports from contests in 68 or 69. SAM guys hadn't shaken out all the old spark ignition engines tucked away in attics or Grandpa's garage; and folks like Bruce Chandler and Otto Bernhardt (over in the original SCIFs) hadn't started to make spark ignition conversions of glow engines. The replica engine manufacturers—for Super Cykes, Brown Jrs, Torpedos etc hadn't gotten off the ground either. So the SCAMPS were flying glow engines on old time models. I remember Abe Gallas had a Cox .09 on a 51" Stratostreak in those reports from SCAMPS contests. And the SCAMPS created the 020 Replica FF old timer event.

Pond kept pushing old timer style events at the AMA Nats as "demonstrations". There's some dispute as to when the first national SAM Championship was held—most place it at Denver in 1966 or 67.

Back on the East Coast Woody Woodman and Joe Beshar were among the leaders of people putting radios in the sorts of models they'd flown in their youth (i.e. "old timers") They'd advertise their contests at the Westchester Model Show in New York. SAM HOF member Richard Tanis claims that he was the first guy on the East Coast to come up with a set of rules for the events that Woodman and Beshar and their friends were flying and—according to Tanis—"my idea saved SAM". Well maybe---the piece in the November 2022 SAM 21 newsletter indicated that there was a split between fliers in Northern and Southern California about the rules for their events—and that Don Bishop (It is actually **Don Bekins**, bc.) may have been the one to come up with a unified set of


rules. Down south in the SCIF club (SAM Chapter 3) there was a bitter schism between FF purists and guys who wanted to fly RC old timer models. The RC guys led by Otto Bernhardt split off and formed SAM Chapter 49.

So there was a lot going on in different parts of the country during the early 60s through the mid 1970s—and much of it was going in different directions based on local membership and preference.

The Society of Antique Modelers was incorporated in New Jersey in 1976—and got its tax exempt status there for both the State of New Jersey and the Feds. The original articles of incorporation were signed by half a dozen guys—John Pond, Tim Dannels, Joe Beshar and Woody Woodman among them. So there was now a single national parent organization


But from my point of view the single most important thing in the growth of SAM was John column "Plug Sparks" which first appeared in Model Builder magazine ~1974. Bill Northrup was editor of the magazine—and there'd been a couple of early articles or columns about old timer models. But that writer was replaced by Pond. And now John Pond had a national forum to promote SAM—and boy did he ever. Each month John gave out news about SAM doings—and the magazine had an old timer model plan each month. Pond- or Daddv Warbucks as some called him-- was the absolute father of SAM as we knew it in its heyday. He traveled to Australia; he traveled to England and he travelled to SAM contests around the country promoting the movement.


