

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

SCAMPS NEWS by Clint Brooks

Welcome to the Jungle.....have you been to Perris lately? Flying has resumed with the cessation of the heavy rain pattern but in it's wake mother nature has provided a bounty of new foilage everywhere. It's hailed as the super bloom in the news with a lot of beautiful wildflowers everywhere-Golden Poppys we haven't seen in years are dotting the hillsides. For us, we have head high weeds surrounding the flying field, but on average about waist high. It's a challenge for models drifting over these areas and landing-you really have to be tracking closely to find it. At the same time, it's nice to have the smells and sounds of the meadow as part of the free flight experience again-it's an extreme pleasure to be out in that environment. Fair warning-get those gaitors ready as the beautiful meadow is going to be raging with foxtails and



other annoying stickers very soon! Contest flying has resumed with the Annual Taibi contest completed on March 12th. Joe and Linda Jones kindly CD'd this contest for us. It was a fairly light turnout but all were excited to be flying and there was great comeraderie evident throught the morning. Mostly the Gas flyers prevailed-I planned to fly my OT rubber group but forgot my toolbox in packing the night before. George Walter loaned me a crocket hook and wiggle tube so I could make some motors and Rob Cobb loaned me a stiff wire to grasp the daunting end after winding. I put up three attempts with my Beaumont *Sticker* small rubber stick but the green was inhibiting any thermal formations that day-I didn't see anyone climbing in lift all morning. Al Arnold showed up-I hadn't seen him in quite some time. He's been having some health issues but he looked pretty good-great to see him back amongst us.

The second mission of the day was to resume the safari to find Lee Hine's E-36 model lost to the

jungle the day before. A crew of four failed to find it even with the use of an electronic tracker. Lee came back with me and brought his Yagi tracker antenna to use this time. Since he has problems with mobility I was deployed with the Yagi to resume the quest. Lance Powers was already manually searching on his own and I joined forces with him in the tall wet green. Magically I got to a point where the signal became omni directional which meant I should be standing very near the signal source. Lance was scanning in the opposite direction from me and came upon the modelabout fifty feet from where I was standing. Victoriously we emerged from the jungle to warm smiles and admiration-it took the rest of the morning for me to completely dry out-I wished I had worn full waders for that effort.



The weekend following this was the SCAT Annual-this was my first attendance and I highly recommend the event. Lost Hills is very green and the mud from February is gone. In it's place are ruts from vehicles driven around on the field during this time, and a lot of these are covered with heavy growth. Riding a bicycle or motorcycle across the field on retrieves is fairly hazardous and if you go to the contests this spring you would be wise to travel slowly on your retrieves and smart to ride around the area before you start flying to learn where the bad rutting is located. If someone thinks about it-bring small landscape marker flags that can be placed near particularly bad locations so there is something visible at a short distance. Unfortunately Tim Batik rode his motorcycle through a deep rut on Sunday and was thrown off to the tune of severe scrapes on his arm and legs from the craggy dried mud associated with the rutting, so beware.

Contest reports follow for the Taibi Annual and recently completed Club contest. Joe Jones has been taking on the CD chores of late-please thank him for all he has done to keep the contest spirit going for the club.

13th Annual Taibi Contest Report

The 13th Annual SCAMPS Taibi contest was held at Taibi International in Perris on Sunday, March 12, 2017. We had a beautiful day for the contest. There was a light ground fog before sunrise. The fog burned off as soon as the sun came over the mountains. There was very light drift all day. Even when we left at 1:45, there was almost no breeze. There was a lot of water in the drainage channel. Several airplanes got close; a few got wet. Retrieval toward San Jacinto road was very challenging and airplanes were difficult to find because the weeds and grass were waist-deep and wet. People came back from chases exhausted and soaked. Fortunately, with the light drift most chases were close.



Kevin Sherman was the contest director. He scheduled the event, got the AMA sanction, and prepared the score sheets and award certificates. His ongoing medical problems prevented him from attending. Linda and I took care of the Taibi International activities.

We welcomed some old and new faces. Brad LeVine was there with his wife, Rose. He entered Small Old Time Rubber and flew his tow-line glider. Ken Kaiser and Alan Arnold, both recovering from medical issues, attended. Ken flew ABC Old Timer with help from son Don.

The day started with a success. Clint Brooks and Lance Powers found Lee Hines' E-36 which Lee had lost the previous day. I do not think any other airplanes were lost in spite of the challenging retrieval conditions.

Turnout was light. Field conditions may have scared off some potential participants. There were eleven flyers making twenty-two entries. We had nine events to be contested.

The signature event is the All Taibi, which had only three entries. In this event, any of Sal's designs can be flown to the rules of the era they were designed -- all fly 3-minute maxes. Over the years, *Stardusters* dominated. This year a *Spacer* won!

It looked like this would be a fight between Ron Thomas' K&B 6.5-powered *Starduster 900* and Jeff Carman's K&B 41-powered *Starduster 900*. Ron and Jeff both maxed the first flight. On the second flight, Jeff suffered a bad engine run, resulting in a broken motor mount and ending his participation. Ron dropped the second flight with a 173-second flight and went on to max his third flight.

Rob Cobb came in late after completing his *Perris Special* flights. He posted a max on his first flight, and dropped his second flight with 174 seconds. He went on to max his third flight to win the event by one second. He was flying the same Veco 19-powered *Spacer* he lost out-of-sight straight up last year. (It was found by a "good guy" and returned through Phil Ronney the next day.)

There were four entries in *Perris Special*. Ron Thomas' OS 25-powered Mark II version posted three maxes to win the event. Ray Peel's Veco 19-powered Mark II posted maxes on the first and third flights. He dropped the second flight with 158 seconds. Phil Ronney's OS Max 25-powered Mark II also maxed the first and third flights, dropping the second flight with 144 seconds. Rob Cobb's Veco 19-powered Mark I was fourth. Rob had adventures flying across the channel just missing the water on his second flight. His third flight went into the tall growth to the north, requiring about an hour to retrieve.

There were only two entries in ABC Old Timer. Phil Ronney's diesel-powered *Strato Streak* won the event posting 466 seconds. Ray Peel's diesel-powered *Alert* posted 162 seconds on his first flight and maxed his second flight, giving him a good chance for a win. However, lack of glide turn on the second flight led to a very difficult and time-consuming retrieval across San Jacinto Road, leaving insufficient time for a third flight.

There were five entries in Small Old-Time Rubber. Paul Guiso entered both his *Wren* and *Gollywock*. He won the event with his *Gollywock* and finished third with his *Wren*. Clint Brooks flew his Ray Beaumont-designed 1942 *Sticker* to second place. Brad Le Vine flew his *Al-V-Diego* to fourth place. George Walter's *Gollywock* was fifth following a failure that led to a 9-second flight and no third flight.

There was only one entry in Large Old-Time Rubber. George Walter's *Red Buzzard* won the event, in spite of a very close call on the edge of the channel.

There were five entries in ABC Nostalgia. Ray Peel, flying a Veco 19-powered *Fubar X*, and Jeff Carman, flying an OS 29-powered *Dixilander*, both posted three maxes early. Ray Peel landed within about twenty feet of his launch point on his second flight. They then put on a fly-off with near simultaneous launch for what at the time appeared to be the win. Ray had a slightly better power pattern and finished higher.

Ray posted 159 seconds compared to Jeff's 143 seconds. At the time, Hulan Matthes had one max with is OS 35-powered Texan 690. He went on to post two more maxes to set up a fly-off for a possible win. He put up a very nice flight to easily get his fourth max and the win. Ken Kaiser and Ron Thomas were both flying OS 29-powered *Texans*. They both dropped their first flight, resulting in 4th place for Ron and 5th for Ken. Ron suffered from the dreaded short DT on his first flight.

There were only two entries in ½ A Nostalgia. Jeff Karman was flying a Medallion .049-powered *Texan*. Don Kaiser was flying a Medallion .049-powered *Top Banana*. Jeff put up two flights to Don's one to win the event.

There were no entries in either the AMA A/B Electric or the E-36 event.

March Contest Results

The SCAMPS March Contest on March 15th included FAC Greve Mass Launch, P-30 Rubber, ½ A AMA + Nostalgia Gas, and AMA Electric. The weather was beautiful with mild temperatures, minimal drift, and light air with little lift.

There were six Greve Racers present – Dale Funk's *Mr. Smoothie*, George Clifford's *Mr. Smoothie*, Fernando Ramos' *Goon*, Roger Willis' *Fire Cracker*, Pat McMillan's *Chambermaid*, and Bernie Crowe's *Mr. Smoothie*. Dale, George, Pat, and Roger are members of the FAC Oasis Fliers. With six



entries, we flew three rounds, eliminating two after the first round and one after the second round. The remaining three flew for the championship.

All the Greve racers got off to good start in the first round. The remaining four were separated by only five seconds. The second-round flights were very close, with Bernie Crowe being dropped by one second. In the final round, Pat McMillan's *Chambermaid* suffered from excessive torque turn leaving the championship to Dale Funk and George Clifford. Dale Funk's *Mr. Smoothie* again got very high and finished his winning flight across the channel for the third time. George Clifford's *Mr. Smoothie* started with low altitude circles and then recovered to gain altitude. The energy expended on the initial turns denied him the altitude he needed. There were only two entries in P-30 Rubber. Bernie Crowe and Lance Powers were both flying *Majestyks*. John Powers had his P-30 at the field but did not enter. Lance Powers posted two 120-second maxes, followed by a 109-second flight. Bernie Crowe posted 77 and 89 seconds on his two flights. P-30 results were:

There were five entries in All ½ A AMA + Nostalgia Gas. Ray Peel and Ron Thomas suffered early difficulties that prevented them from making official flights. Ray's *Ramrod* had a loose motor mount and Ron's *Starduster* suffered a broken fuselage from a test flight DT. Jeff Carman's *Texan* won the event by one second over Phil Ronney's *Condor*. 



Note to guests interested in observing or flying free flight models at Perris:

The usual time to catch us in the act is in the morning. Most Saturday mornings are when people come out to test fly or tune up their models and skills, and just have a good time. You can observe a handful of top FAI rubber and glider flyers along with with others flying a range of model types-mostly endurance rubber powered and electric or gas powered. Scale free flight models are flown when the Scale Staffel has their FAC contests also noted above. These are typically conducted over two day periods to get in all the event categories normally flown. Flying usually starts 7-ish and ends late morning depending on winds, which typically rise by 1 pm due to the coastal convergence zone Elsinore Valley is famous for. This also creates outstanding lift conditions which is one of the reasons we are there. Come join us-see the map above for an idea on directions-it's on the east side of the 215 freeway, off San Jacinto Ave.-there is a dirt road entrance on the right.
