





SCAMPS NEWS

Sadly, we start with the news that long time club member Ken Kaiser has passed away due to post-surgery complications. Our condolences go out to his family and friends-Ken was a well loved member of the SoCal modeling community. He participated in all aspects of modeling for free flight, control line and radio control. He was also a pilot and had built his own Rutan Quickee experimental aircraft. We will all miss him as time passes-he was a fun guy to have on the field and seemed to know just about everything-except rubber power which he claimed to have only a thimble full of knowledge about. No worries-he tore it up as a Nostalgia gas flier and really kept that aspect of the free flight sport on the front burner for the San Valeers and SCAMPS for many years. He will always be in our hearts.



Now that we have had a hard summer of trudging through the mounds of Perris, I see a lot of Pixis GPS trackers in use, and even joined the Pixis club in August. This is a sweet device that can pinpoint your model and tell you almost (within a few feet) exactly where it is, allowing you to decide the best way to retrieve it and forget about maintaining a traditional line of sight through inhospitable terrain. I'm sure Mike Pykelney is pleased to have the business and suspect sales of this device will continue to mount for him. As for me, I have not deployed it in a model yet, but my upcoming construction of *Super 'Y'* T-2 will include a wing bay to contain this gold nugget.

October is going to be wall to wall free flight contests between Lost Hills, Boulder City and Jean, Nevada. A lot of this is planned to facilitate participation by people out to support the FAI World Champs in mid-October, and offer a series of contests to attend while they are in the area. It's your chance to go on a local world tour-consider taking in one or two of the main events if you can.

Speaking of main events, the Fab February event is in need of help for the Issacsson AMA contest. I'm not sure if a CD has stepped up to run this yet, but whoever it is is going to need the support of clubs to facilitate contest events they specialize in. SCAMPS would typically support our charter SAM type contest flying, San Valeers the gas powered events, etc. We have not discussed this as group yet, but I do want to put the word and idea out that this contest will be much better if there is a large supporting group focused on key events instead of one person trying to keep it all together. It's important to settle on the contest agenda and get the event calendar out before November, so all of us can plan plus everyone else in the world who might want to participate when they come over to fly in February. Last year the agenda went out so late it was not taken seriously, and the resulting effect was somewhat dismal for participation. If you want great contests, you have to support them when the call goes out. I will be glad to channel all thoughts for the SCAMPS if there are any ideas among you.

Our September Club contest presented fairly hot weather as expected, but it also provided us with significant drift towards San Jacinto Road, despite forecasts of very light breeze. This fact alone discouraged many from flying and suffering long chases through the dreaded wasteland to the north. I know – I was one of them!

Our scheduled events were P-30 (traditionally one of the more popular events), Moffett rubber (wait, what? What's a Moffett?), Golden Age Gas, and AMA Electric. We had the regular good turnout, but very few competition fliers. P-30 saw only five entries, and as it turned out only three of those flew. Lance Powers was trimming his Oldenkamp "Hot Box" and got the blast tube wrapped up in his rubber, so did not fly. I intended to fly my "Majestyk", but spent most of the morning retrieving my Moffett from its one and only flight, so missed P-30 and almost (gasp!) the donuts. Jerry Clark had his Boomer ("Boomer-esque" is the proper term, I believe -Ed) going well, but its first flight put him way out in the weeds and he searched for a long time before Paul Guiso found it, too late to fly. Dave Wade dropped 21 seconds his first flight, and though he maxed the next he elected to sit out the final round. Linda Wrisley, flying her "Tail Firster" (canard, natch!) put up three perfect flights to take the win. Congrats Linda!

AMA Electric had two entries (Clint was absent due to family illness), and neither Hal nor I made an official flight. Me, because as I said, I spent most of the morning retrieving, and Hal because he thought better of it. Golden Age Gas (for planes designed from 1957 to 1969) fared no better. Ron Thomas and Hulan Mathies entered, but Hulan elected not to fly, leaving Ron to take the win with 356 out of 360!

Moffett is, or was, one of the most popular rubber events at the Nats, with up to twenty entries, and hotly contested each year. They are very high-performance models, and are a blast to fly. In open competition they fly three flights to three-minute maxes, then 4-, 5- etc. until someone drops. Max flight time at the Nats is often seven or eight minutes. Not really suitable for our field, especially in its current state, admittedly, but too much fun not to try. The week before our contest the drift was towards the West and retrieving in the field towards the freeway was pretty easy. So, if the conditions are right... I'll have more info on these zippy little planes in the next newsletter.

Anyway, Carl Redlin and I decided to try it, and I got my 14-year-old model out of mothballs and retrimmed (sorta). I thought I'd get my first flight in early before the drift got too bad, and launched at about 08:35. The plane climbed straight up for twenty seconds, gaining about 500 ft of altitude, and settled into a steady glide. It obviously found some lift up there, because it was still there when it DTd at around three minutes. Carl watched where it went and decided the drift was just too much and elected not to fly.

I wasn't getting a signal from my tracker at first, but some ways out the signal came in and guided me to the plane. It took me around 40 or 50 minutes to get to it, and then another half hour or more to wend my way back through the weeds. Eventually Ron Thomas found me floundering back towards the flight line. I got back just after 10:00, and decided not to risk another flight.

Very disappointing overall, except for Ron Thomas and Linda Wrisley! Let's hope for lighter winds in the future. Next month's contest is for OT Small Rubber, Perris Special, OT Sport Glow, E36, and E20. Should be cooler, let's have a good turn out!

Note to guests interested in observing or flying free flight models at Perris:

The usual time to catch us in the act is in the morning. Most Saturday mornings are when people come out to test fly or tune up their models and skills, and just have a good time. You can observe the Southern California Aero Team (SCAT) FAI rubber and glider flyers along with with others flying a range of model types-mostly endurance rubber powered and electric or gas powered. Scale free flight models are flown when the Scale Staffel has their FAC contests also noted above. These are typically conducted over two day periods to get in all the event categories normally flown. Flying usually starts 7-ish and ends late morning depending on winds. There is a larger group that flies on Wednesday as well if you would rather make a mid-week trip. Come join us-see the map above for an idea on directions-it's on the east side of the 215 freeway, off San Jacinto Ave.-there is a dirt road entrance on the right.
