

SCAMPS NEWS

It's the end of December as this is being composed and already we have had enough rain events to turn everything green. The immediate flying area at Perris is now getting a new fringe of green and there is a very good surface for flying towline gliders or other designs that an overgrown field would normally hinder or make impossible. Take note-those delicate scale models will soon have a plush landing site for testing-time to get them ready if you have them.

I spent a good part of 2019 working on an enlarged version of the *Joulebox* E-36 model, that I have dubbed "*Super 'J'*". Two test models were built to get the moments adjusted and the overall model sizing right for the drive train system. At this point, I'm very pleased with the results and have already made pre-production kits

available to a few fliers who had encouraged this development. The design targets the AMA Electric



A/B class, and has a design option for auto rudder as the B class allows auto surfaces to be used, whereas A does not. Flying it is about the same as the E36 version, just bigger and more powerful. The glide perfomance is more than what I expected-there is something to having a larger model that affects this I think. I'm hoping having a model design specifically targeting this event will help give it more popularity eventually. It's a well attended event further East, a little less so out here in the West. If you get the bug, try one-it's a blast to fly.

This year the SCAMPS Christmas party was hosted by Nancy Kaiser at her home in Cypress. It was very well attended, with catering from the Olive Garden to keep us all well fed and jolly. A lot of great socializing was observed. Even Daniel Heinrich made it down from the high desert to join in, and the club was able to present an appreciation award for the years of service he provided as club president. Many thanks to Nancy for hosting this event-I hope having the free flight community in her home again helps with the loss of Ken. We sure enjoyed being with her and hope there is more bonding as we all go forward in time.

SCAMPS Club contest Wednesday December 18, 2019

There was a contest scheduled for 12/11, but weather conditions squashed those plans and the field became unusable for a week. I flew the following Sunday with SDO and the field looked pretty good, so Bernie put out the email flash for a rescheduled club contest for the 18th. Plans were for Large OT Rubber combined, Nostalgia Gas and Electric combined, and AMA Electric A/B.

Upon arrival at San Jacinto Blvd around 7:30 AM, I found the road closed at the flood gate and a detour around the entire North side of the field that included the entrance road. Looking to the east, I could see others had made it onto the field, so I followed the detour around and accessed the field on the rough road that bounds the east side of the property. This path was a bit perilous, with some large muddy ruts and all sorts of indiscriminate trash littering the ground as supplied by the locals. This made crossing an area out of the mud a bit un-nerving as I was afraid of my tires getting punctured by hidden sharp things. Fortunately, I did not experience any problems in this regard.

Arriving at the flying site, I observed Bernie, Lance and David Wade actively working at breaking down the berm that has formed around the access road mud puddles. This was causing some cars on the Sunday prior to get high centered on it, so we had planned to work on reducing the height in a few spots to provide a path through the small mountain of the berm. I joined in, and soon we had some small cuts made that seemed like they would help. The observation after starting the work was it was somewhat akin to boiling the ocean, but focusing on getting just enough removed to allow a car to pass made it bearable. Even though the puddle water was frozen and the ground felt like it was, the strenuous work soon had us shedding the jackets we had on. Luckily, I had gloves with me and avoided the blistered hands that surely would have resulted from handling the tools.

Finally, we went back to the field area and set up for flying. Aside from those mentioned, Randy and Linda Wrisley were also present. Others arrived at San Jacinto and were defeated by the closure, so turned back. The contest for the day was looking like it was over before it started.


I had brought out my bungee launch towline rig, as had David. Both were set up-his using 3/32 rubber on the launcher, mine with 1/16 rubber for the launcher. I find the Thermic Trooper seems to perform better with a little less power on the tow and gains much better height before releasing. My A-1 style glider still performs on the softer launcher, so this is what I assembled to fly for the day.

Conditions were calm and quiet, and everyone except Bernie was flying towline gliders. The field surface is perfect for this right now-hardly any tumbleweeds or other snagging material, and it was easy to maneuver around and keep the launchers from being caught on the ground. Eventually I challenged the others to a contest, and they agreed. It was six flight attempts for the highest cumulative time, and two-minute max. Given the calmness and temperature, it seemed like two minutes would have been a challenge for any of the gliders.

This was mid-morning, and the intermittent sun was starting to warm things up. I was launching across the field toward the south side, and I repeatedly found light lift coming off the road or berms that were heating enough to propagate some warm rising air. The glider orbited and stayed upwind for the most part. A few times it went off across the drainage ditch and DT'd, but having the models stay on the field area made it a delightful event. I did pull off a few maxes for the day, I don't think anyone else quite did due to the light conditions and trim issues with their gliders. The towline event is really fun and I hope more club members will consider trying it this year as we have it a least three times in the 2020 club contest calendar.

Bernie put together his *Fugette* E36 model for some AMA Electric action, but I declined to compete as I was well into the glider event. Bernie's model was flying well and finding great lift in the light air-it would have been a good run for that event. Next time out it will be something to be reckoned with again.

Leaving the field, it was decided the east side road was the best way out, as the creek bed the road crosses further to the south was reported unpassable by David, who had seen it during a retrieval at some point earlier. I was last off the field, as I had replaced my launcher rubber while I had everything out. As I came down the road, I observed Bernie and David standing near Bernie's SUV, firmly anchored in a muddy rut. Flashes of my Lost Hills Ike muddy road passage came to mind. In this case, there was no way to wiggle the vehicle loose as I had done for mine at Lost Hills, and Bernie called AAA and was waiting for rescue. Lesson learned-don't drive in the muddy areas unless you have caterpillar drive on your vehicle. It's slicker and deeper than you think.

On the Sunday prior, Lance had brought out some bags of gravel and used them to roughly fill the ditch forming at the entrance road threshold. This should help slow down the erosion provided it doesn't get the large trucks driving over it too many times. Now, if we all send mental messages to the farmer that he needs to flatten the mounds we will be in much better shape for a flying field. Bernie had provided a Christmas card we all signed on Wednesday, and an Amazon gift card courtesy of Lance Powers was part of it. At least we haven't been forced out yet, and hoping he will be considerate of us moving forward.




Contest action is already going for 2020, starting with the Southwest Regionals in Eloy, AZ on January 18, 19 & 20. This is an ongoing classic that covers all aspects of outdoor free flight. The 2020 Lost Hills Fab February is in the initial registration stages for the FAI events, and so far, nothing has been pushed out for the AMA Ike contest. Hopefully there will be an event calendar and information announcement soon. Our first SCAMPS contest will be the 16th Annual Taibi Contest currently scheduled for Sunday, March 8. Take a look at the 2020 Perris Field event calendars at the end of the newsletter to get a sense of what is being planned right now.

One of the things you notice is the SDO group does a lot of Coupe events throughout the year. This can be any coupe model you want, and there are some great simple classic coupe designs you can build and easily fly without resorting to an expensive composite F1G design, although these are welcome too.

If you haven't tried coupe, it's just a step up from P-30 in a way. You are still limited to ten grams of rubber, and the minimum model weight is 70 grams, which is about 30 more than the P-30 minimum.

So, you can see the challenge and the fun of flying these models. There is no restriction on wing span/area or propeller system. I'm planning to make a new Majestyk coupe (big brother to the Majestyk P-30) which is an all stick and tissue design. Maybe a few of you would like to join in on that-I will supply copies of the drawing if you are interested. You might enjoy trying something like this in 2020 if you are already getting P-30 wired.

Last item-2020 club dues are now due. If you mail a check and have changed your email or phone number, etc., please complete the enclosed form for updated roster information.

Note to guests interested in observing or flying free flight models at Perris:

The usual time to catch us in the act is in the morning. Most Saturday mornings are when people come out to test fly or tune up their models and skills, and just have a good time. You can observe the Southern California Aero Team (SCAT) FAI rubber and glider flyers along with with others flying a range of model types-mostly endurance rubber powered and electric or gas powered. Scale free flight models are flown when the Scale Staffel has their FAC contests also noted above. These are typically conducted over two day periods to get in all the event categories normally flown. Flying usually starts 7-ish and ends late morning depending on winds. There is a larger group that flies on Wednesday as well if you would rather make a mid-week trip. Come join us-see the map above for an idea on directions-it's on the east side of the 215 freeway, off San Jacinto Ave.-there is a dirt road entrance on the right.

Old Timer designs will get a 20 second HL, then 15 in Fly-off. All 3 minute max.
