

SCAMPS NEWS

First this month, a big Happy 85th Brithday to Hal Cover, who celebrated it on August 21st at son Scott's home in Fullerton. I couldn't make it, but from what I gather it was a fun bash for everyone. I hope you get many more Hal, and we get to keep enjoying your company when we get together and fly.

In mid-August I was treated to the joy of ignition flying courtesy of Joe Jones. He has loaned me a C-class *Dodger* with an Ohlssen .60 sparky installed. After briefing me on all the equipment and quirks at his home, we met at Perris the following Wednesday and attempted an air show. Of course, I had put on an old O&R 14 inch prop I had from Allan Arnold's collection and inadvertanly allowed the contact point spring to slip out of place when

tightening the prop nut. This was not discovered until after 20 minutes of troubleshooting the electrical system to realize the points were not closing. Once Joe sorted that out I had my first spark plug hand shock verifying electrical continuity had been restored. So, I put the wing on and lit the fuse to get ready for flight! Hand cranking the beast resulted in no comment from the engine, and Phil Ronney graciously allowed me to use his starting stooge to speed up the process. Even with this aid, it still took a few minutes of torquing to get the first pops of ignition to sound, then became more of a series of pops until Joe motioned me to pull the model away from the starter. The lever on the spark advance had dropped down, so the spark was well retarded and the engine was barely running. Joe motioned to ease the lever up slowly to advance the spark and the engine began to pick

up speed, but still felt rich. So, adjusting the needle valve took about three turns to finally get the Ohlsson singing strongly enough to launch the model. At least this part went well and went perfectly out of my hands into a level shallow turn to the left, slowly making it's way skyward. Just when you start to admire the power flight, the engine quit and the model continued to the left toward the line of parked cars, but luckily had gained enough altitude to overfly and eventually slide down to a nice wheel landing.

Back to the starting table for some more fuel and a new length of fuse. This time the engine started right up and I was able to get a much leaner song out of it. The launch again went well and the model showed an improved climb attitude on the leaner setting. I think it ran a few more seconds than the first flight and repeated the short run and slow glide to a nice wheel landing.

My enthusiasm began to build-hey this is fun! A third length of fuse, and a return to the starting stooge for another quick start. But this time it sagged and quit. Hmmmm-another start, same result, another start, another and a few more after that, all ending with the engine sagging and quitting. At this point we were nearing 90 degrees on the field, and I think the Ohlssen had seen enough for that day and wanted to cool off. I retired the effort and took the *Dodger* back to my truck for de-rig and putting away. Joe came over to tell me it was about as typical an ignition engine session that there is, and pronounced me a qualified Ignition Engine flier! Another feather in my hat I suppose, but I am a little proud of that fact. It was like trying to fly in 1942 again-we have it very, very good today for equipment technology and quality. I can understand the charm these old timers and sparky engines exhibit for those who are committed to flying them. It's quite a skill set to have in your modeling resume. Thanks Joe, for letting me in on this world.

Club contest report August 2022

The forecast for this month's Club contest called for temps around 100F in the afternoon, so we started promptly with the goal of finishing early. One logical approach would have been to cut out donuts and get some flying done instead, but you know how THAT goes! We were flying P30 and OT Large Rubber, AMA Gas and Electric combined, Electric Nostalgia, and a Special Event sponsored by Randy Wrisley – Buffalo Tick cat-launched glider.

Buffalo Tick turned out to be hugely popular, and soon the skies were full of diminutive little planes skittering around the field like a cloud of moths (some poetic license is allowed in this publication!) Plans for the little rascals were published in the June issue of *Hangar Rash*, and Randy and Linda made available kits and plans to kick things off. The rules were more straightforward than the actual flying: plane must be a "Buffalo Tick" model (max span 10" max chord 3"); contestants were allowed six

official flights; and the aggregate of the best three counted as the score. Though all the planes were

Buffalo Ticks, contestants were allowed to choose their own names. Lance Powers flew *Uptick 1*, David Wade fielded *Dee Dub II* (we didn't ask what happened to *Dee Dub!*), Clint flew "no name" and Linda's was named *Penguin*. On enquiry I learned that after an unfortunate early attempt by one flier resulted in a smashed airplane, she suggested they all be named after flightless birds! Linda's high times were 41, 60 (!!), and 21 for a total of 122 and the win! Pretty good for a plane that actually spanned 7 inches! David was next with 75, and Lance and Clint duked it out for totals of 47 and 45. Lotsa fun! I'm going to build one... (editors note: Linda scored highest in the B.T. lineup, but because she was co-hosting the event with Randy, the towline glider kit award went to David Wade who was the next challenger for top honors)

P30 is usually one of our most popular events, but though we had three entries only one actually posted times. Lance's good-flying *Speckled Bird* suffered from the stab sitting up on the stop. It decided it was a *Speckled Post Hole Digger* instead and rendered itself *hors de combat*. I had my *Majestyk* ready for real combat, but simply ran out of time (and steam) after chasing my OT rubber job. David Wade flew his own-design *Perrisite 30* to a solid win with all maxes, save for two seconds on the third flight when he short-DTd it! I guess if you are ever going to do that this was a good occasion!

OT Large Rubber saw four entries, two of them from George Walter. We were flying to 3-minute maxes and there was lots of lift around Carl Redlin pulled out his *Pomona Champ* and blew the dust off it before launching into what might be charitably termed "significant lift". The plane was soon seen flying at approximately sixteen thousand feet and heading towards Temecula (or maybe Escondido) He and Lance took off in chase trying unsuccessfully to bring it down using RDT. (Turned out his RDT battery was low, hence short-ranged.) Eventually Carl returned muttering something about taking up mushroom growing instead of FF, and he elected not to fly again. George flew his reliable *Red Buzzard*, but the lift was tricky and robbed him of his usual 7-minute flights. He later flew his *Lanzo Duplex Cabin*, but did not get the results he wanted. My first flight with my *Lamb Climber* was a doozie, floating of across the creek towards the freeway before DTing at nearly 4 minutes. The next, though, stalled all the way to the ground for a 95. Blasted recurrent stab-slip problem which I thought I had cured! The last flight dropped lift too, so not very satisfying. We missed having Hal Cover and Fernando Ramos in the contest.

In Gas and Electric Combined we got exactly that – Pete Coker flew his class 'A' *Pearl* with a Rossi .15 up front, while Phil Ronney flew his Clint Brooks-designed and kitted *Super J* electric. Both had two maxes and one drop each, with Pete edging Phil 352 to 318.

Electric Nostalgia garnered only one entry – Phil Ronney flying his e-powered *Champion* for the win with three maxes plus an 82. Clint's usual Ramrod entry stayed grounded while he took on the challenge of flying Sal Taibi's ignition powered *Dodger* in preparation for the Taibi Fun Fly next year. Clint said he found ignition a little more complicated than electric!!

Note to guests interested in observing or flying free flight models at Perris:

The usual time to catch us in the act is in the morning. Most Saturday mornings are when people come out to test fly or tune up their models and skills, and just have a good time. You can observe the Southern California Aero Team (SCAT) FAI rubber and glider flyers along with with others flying a range of model types-mostly endurance rubber powered and electric or gas powered. Scale free flight models are flown when the San Diego Scale Staffel has their FAC contests-check their website for schedules. These are typically conducted over two day periods to get in all the event categories normally flown. Flying usually starts 7-ish and ends late morning depending on winds. There is a larger group that flies on Wednesday as well if you would rather make a mid-week trip.


